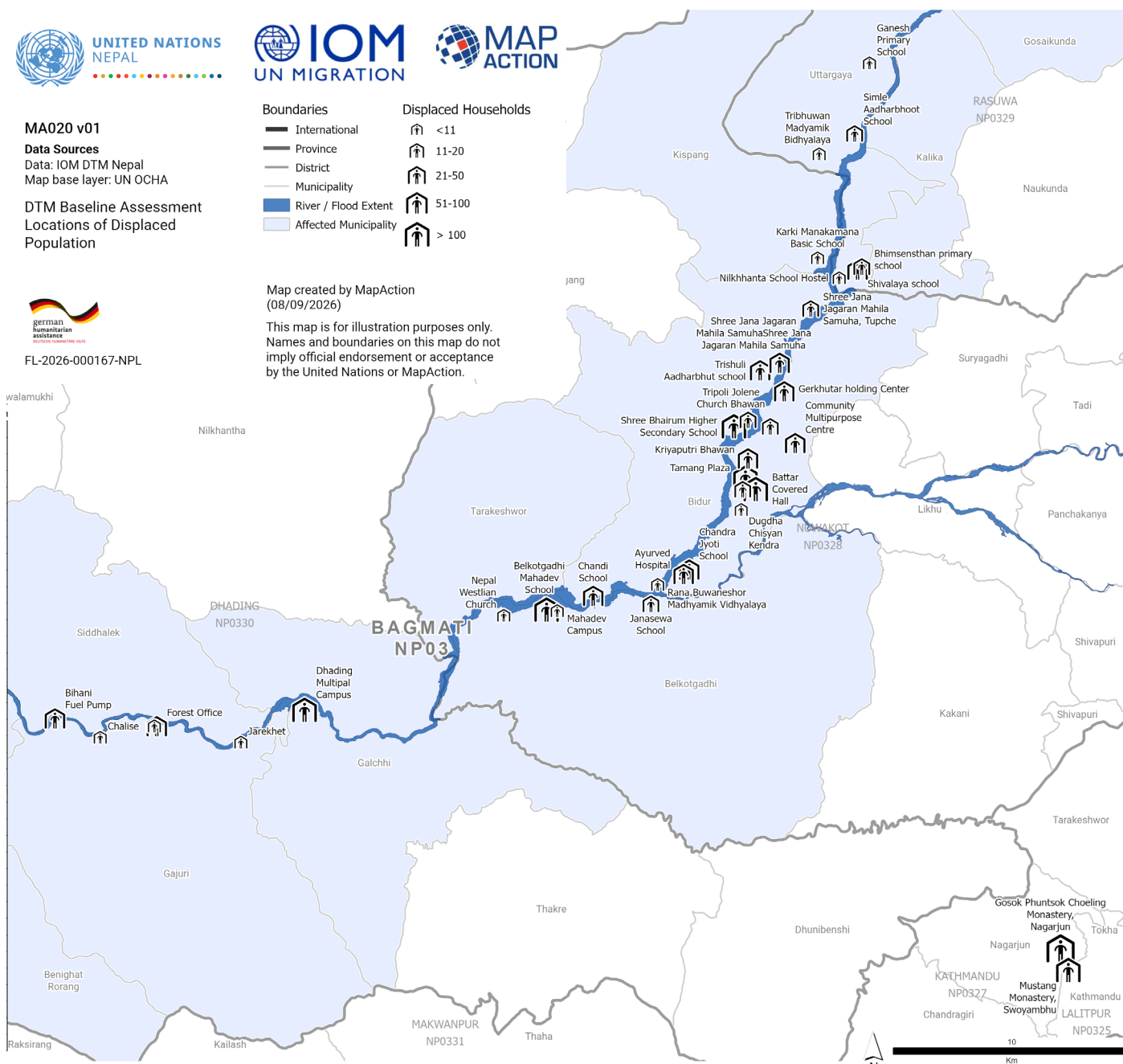

On 26 August 2026, sudden and severe flash floods affected communities across several districts. The floods have caused significant loss of life, displacement, and widespread damage to homes, infrastructure and essential services (IOM, 2026).

The International Organization for Migration is supporting the Government-led response through the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) and deployed a Baseline Site Profile Assessment across 37 sites in the Kathmandu, Dhading, Nuwakot and Rasuwa Districts in the Bagmati Province. This report presents preliminary findings monitoring displacement and vulnerabilities.

FIGURE 2. NUMBER OF DISPLACED HHs AND INDIVIDUALS PER DISTRICT

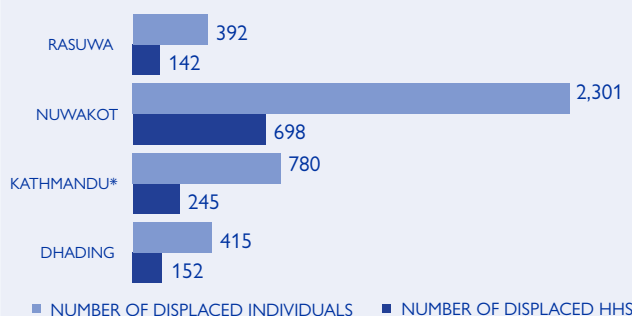


FIGURE 3. SEX AND AGE DISAGGREGATION OF THE DISPLACED POPULATION

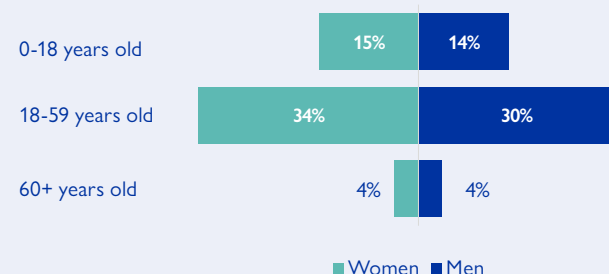


FIGURE 4. AGE DISAGGREGATION OF THE DISPLACED POPULATION PER DISTRICT

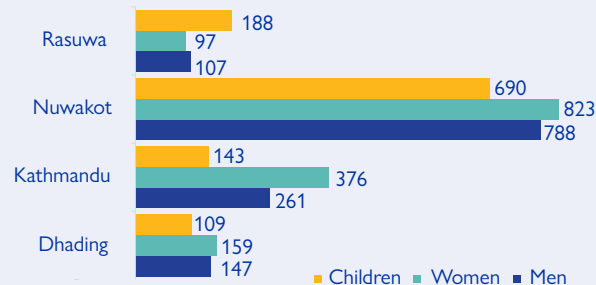


FIGURE 5. FEMALE-HEADED HHs

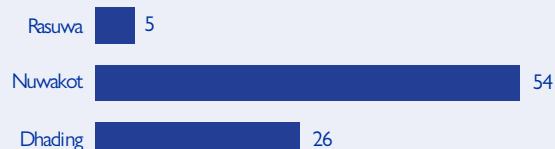


FIGURE 6. CHILD-HEADED HHs

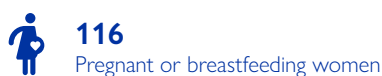
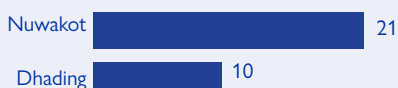


FIGURE 8. PREGNANT OR BREASTFEEDING WOMEN

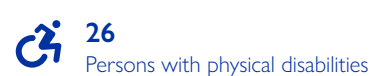
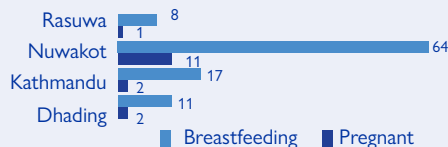


FIGURE 9. PERSONS WITH PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

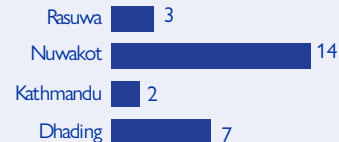


FIGURE 10. SEPARATED OR UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN

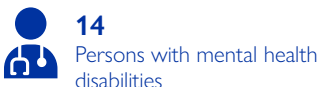
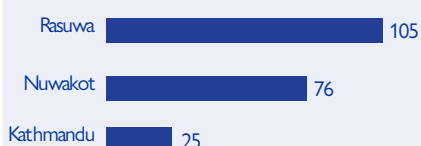


FIGURE 11. PERSONS WITH MENTAL HEALTH DISABILITIES

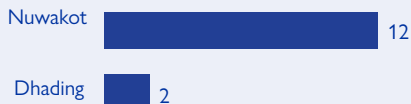


FIGURE 12. PERSONS WITH CHRONIC ILLNESS REQUIRING MEDICATION

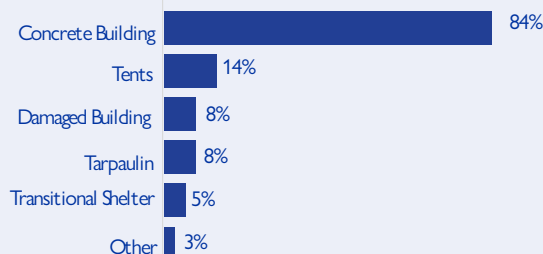

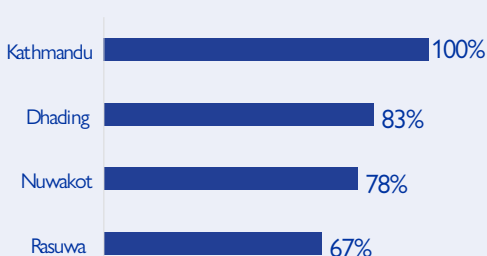

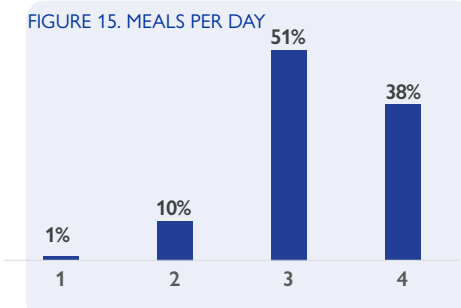

FIGURE 15. MEALS PER DAY



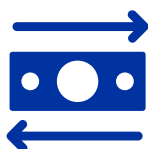

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METHODOLOGY

This preliminary findings of the DTM Baseline Site Profile Assessment analyses data collected between 31 August - 06 September 2026 in 37 sites (or referred to as temporary shelters or 'holding centres' by the Government of Nepal) based across nine municipalities of Nuwakot, Rasuwa, Dhading and Kathmandu districts. The list of temporary shelters for the assessment were initially sourced from the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Authority (NDRRMA) daily situation reports, in addition to identifying new sites during field assessment. A total of 37 key informants, most of whom were site management officials, were interviewed at the site location, however, two were inaccessible and required phone interviews which resulted in incomplete data. These sites are Ganesh Primary School and Simle Aadharbhoot School, in Rasuwa district. For this assessment, a "site" refers to the location where displaced households were hosted as a temporary measure to ensure their safety following the flash flood event. Data collection was conducted by four teams comprising of male and female enumerators - ten in total. All enumerators received training on the questionnaires, survey tool and data collection procedures before the field deployment.

LIMITATIONS

This assessment focused only on the holding centres where displaced population were sheltered at the time of assessment. The number of displaced population who were not present at the time of assessment

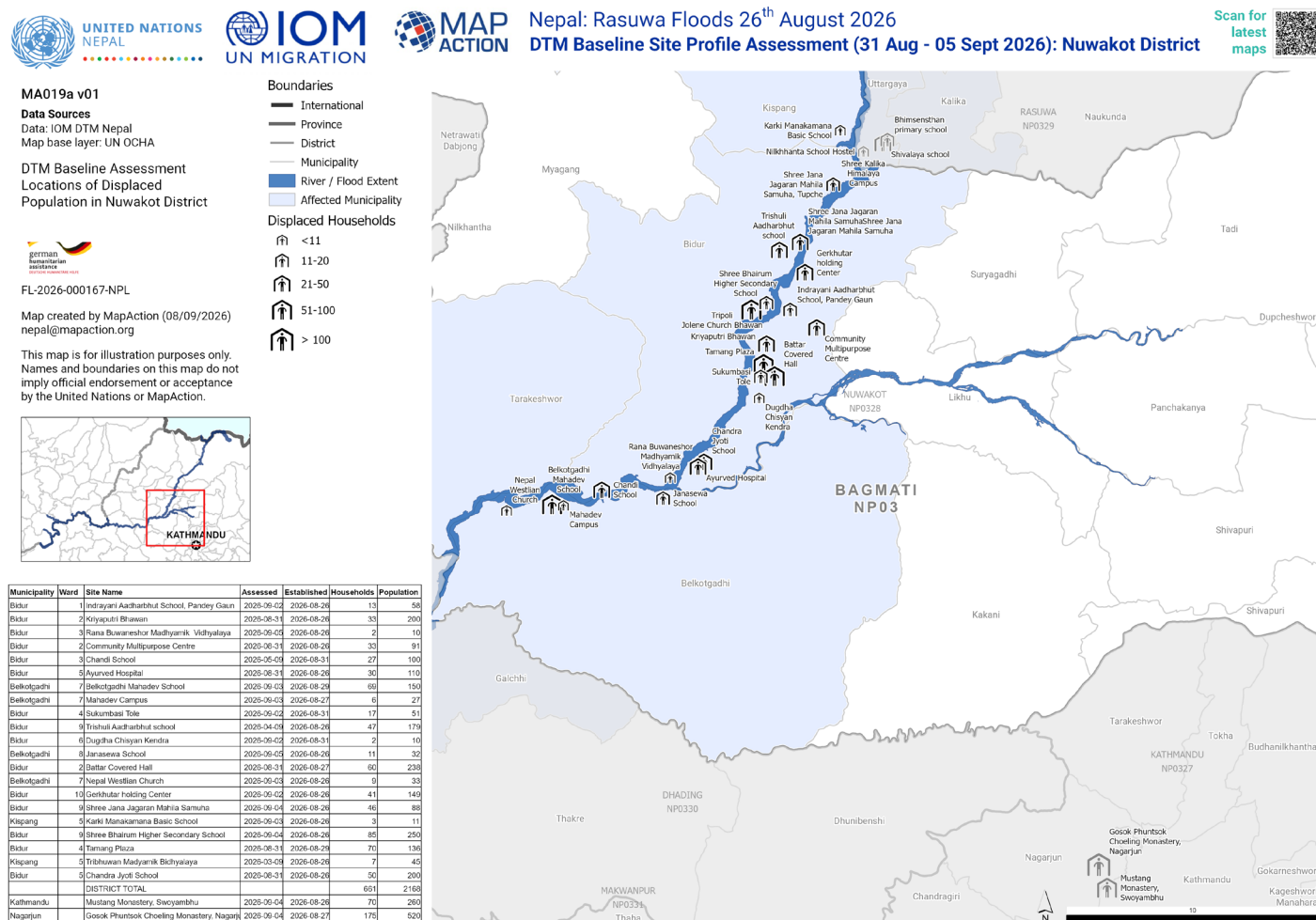

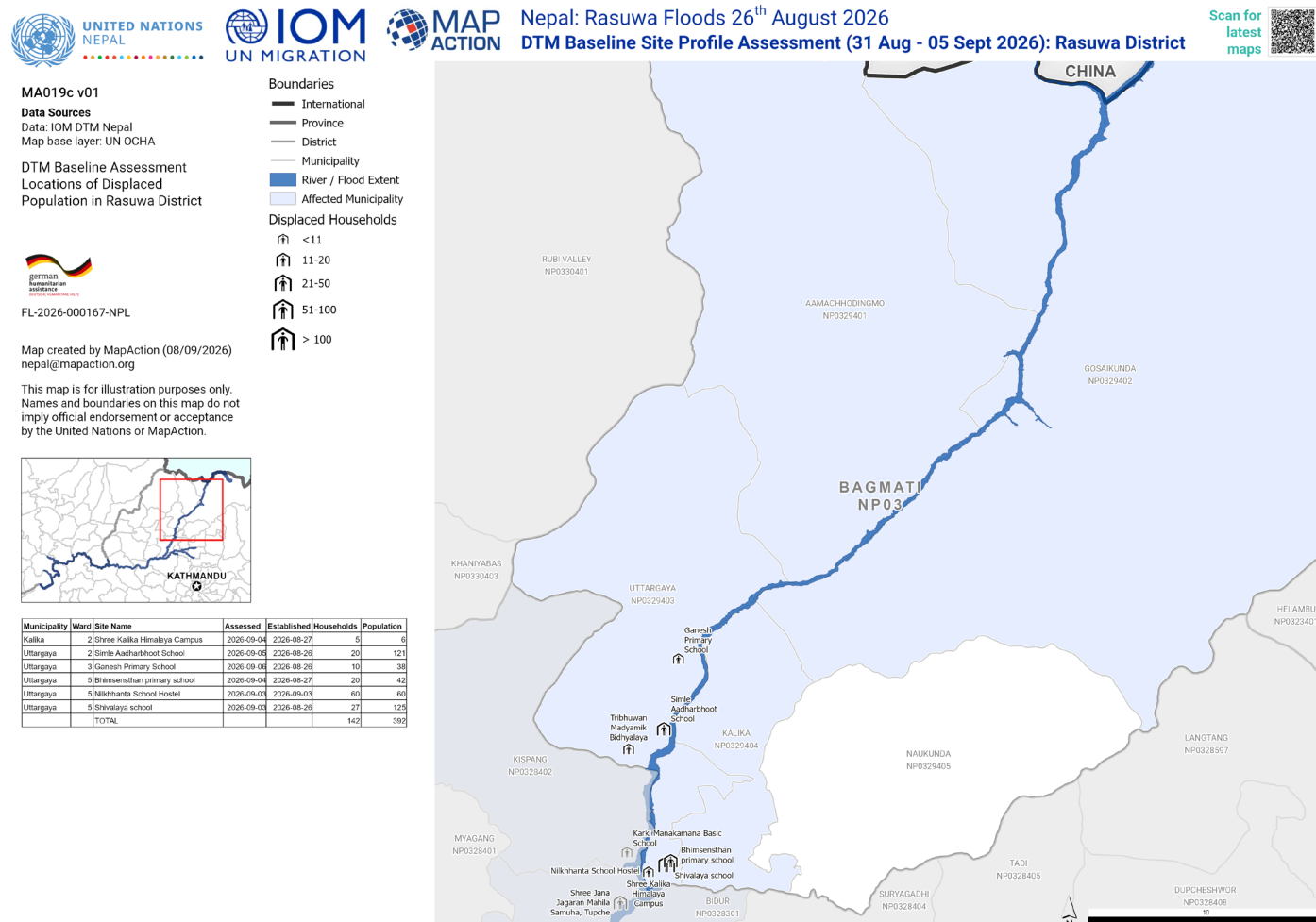
